



Summer Reading Project

Grades 3-4

Dear Parents and Students:

Research tells us that when students don't read for two months their skills regress. Reading is a skill which requires practice, just like baseball or math facts. Summer reading helps students of all ages keep their skills sharp so they are ready when school begins in the fall. Reading throughout the summer not only enhances basic reading skills of young students, it creates unique opportunities for learning, exploring, and growing. The Pleasantville Public Schools Elementary Summer Reading Program is designed to promote reading and learning as an enjoyable activity. The following is a suggested guide to authors, resources, and activities for children to share their reading experience. Please choose any title that may interest your child. We strongly encourage parents to read aloud, including to those children who are already independent readers. In addition, to being a wonderful family activity, children increase their listening vocabulary which improve their comprehension. It also them to develop interest beyond their reading levels.

All directions and pages for this activity are attached along with an example of completing the project.

The requirements: You will be choosing at least two books from the list of books for your grade level. You will then complete a project listed below for each book. This project is due <u>Friday</u>, <u>September 15^{th} </u>.





Choose two projects to complete.

Book Jacket

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- A. For this project use construction paper.
- B. Fold the paper in half. Then fold each end of the paper in to make the inside flaps of the book jacket. C. On the front cover, write the title and the author of your book. Draw and color a picture that is appropriate for your book.
- D. On the front inside flap, write a short statement that will catch a reader's attention.
- E. On the back inside flap, write a short paragraph about your favorite part of the story.
- F. On the back cover, write a summary of the story in your own words. Write your name after the summary.

Book Collage



- A. Create a poster using magazine or newspaper clippings of event and characters from your book.
- B. On your poster include the title of the story, the author's name.
- C. Write a summary of your book to go on your collage.
- D. Make sure you have your name on your collage on the back of the collage.



Shoe Box Diorama



- A. Trace the bottom of a shoe box on a plain piece of paper. Cut out the shape. Make sure it fits into the bottom of the shoe box. Draw and color the background or setting of the scene on this paper. Glue it in the shoe box.
- B. Draw, color, and cut out characters. Attach L-shaped strips of heavy paper to the back of each character. Glue each character to the bottom of the box. Do this for any other props you would like to add to make your scene realistic.
- C. Write a summary of your story in place on the lid of the box.
- D. Place your name on the bottom of the shoe box.





Students should read at least two books and use these books to complete their two project choices.
